Goal 3 – Good Health and Well-being

By collaborating with hospitals, clinics, NGOs, and schools, the winning project offers health seminars and free lingerie to young people. It also provides employment opportunities to underprivileged and unemployed teenage, middle-aged women, breast cancer patients and those recovered from breast cancer.
Silver	Negawatt Utility Limited Negawatt developed a risk analysis system called “Care222” to mitigate the risk of indoor transmission of COVID-19 by measuring the level of virus and advising correspondent disinfection arrangement. For example, the system was installed in The Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre, which helps analyse and deactivate bacteria and viruses in the lobbies.
Bronze	FH Rehabilitation Products Manufacturing Co. Ltd. By offering tailor-made rehabilitation products and door-to-door consultation services, FH Rehabilitation aims to support users throughout their long rehabilitation journey.

Gold	Tony Ip Green Architects Limited Tony Ip collaborated with The Conservancy Association to develop the first community-based urban forestry education centre in Sham Shui Po. By adopting innovative and green building design, the centre will become a new venue for social cohesion.

In response to the growing demand for rehabilitation and gerontechnology products in Hong Kong, FH Rehabilitation leverages its manufacturing capability to improve the quality and safety standards of its products and develop its own rehabilitation and gerontechnology products.
Bronze	mm2 Studios Hong Kong Limited In 2021, mm2 initiated an Artificial Intelligence (AI) system for creative writing, which facilitates screenwriters in researching information during the initial stage in story development.
